The manual includes information and guidelines on the new ways that the Stritch lamp logo will be used in conjunction with the names of colleges, departments and centers to communicate effectively and ensure consistency across many types of use. These new logo applications are part of an ongoing effort to refine and further articulate the University brand in light of exciting new changes, such as the expansion to the City Center location and eventually, the South Shore campus at the Cousins Center site.

This is incorrect.

The correct method of subscribing to these addresses is to send an e-mail to [listserv@stritch.edu](mailto:listserv@stritch.edu) with the message body containing the following: `subscribe staff-list youremailaddress`, or `subscribe faculty-list youremailaddress`. An example of this would be `subscribe staff-list sastritch@stritch.edu`. We regret the error.

## BOOK EDITED BY DR. SOBEHART AVAILABLE IN PAPERBACK AT STRITCH BOOKSTORE

A book edited by Stritch President Dr. Helen C. Sobehart, “Women Leading Education Across the Continents: Sharing the Spirit, Fanning the Flame,” is now available in paperback at the Stritch Bookstore for \$29.95. Faculty and staff receive a 10% discount.

The book is the first collection of research about and stories of women in basic and higher education leadership from every region of the globe. 
