PARKING COMMITTEE PLANS ACTION TO ALLEVIATE ISSUES

An ad-hoc parking committee is continuing to examine ways of improving the parking situation on campus. The committee's goal is to take the recommendations made by the previous parking committee and put them into action. The goals include:

1. Identify and assign new parking areas for different populations (i.e., employees, resident students, commuter students). This would be a more comprehensive extension of existing rules that dictate, for example, that Lot 3 outside Bonaventure Hall is reserved for students only.

2. Create marked spaces in the appropriate lots for campus visitors - both long-term and short-term.

3. Create a new parking sticker program that will delineate the vehicles of employees, resident students, commuters, and others, enabling increased and improved parking enforcement.

4. Reconfigure the circular drives at the west ends of both Duns Scotus and Roger Bacon Halls, creating approximately 60 new spaces. Funds are set aside in the current year capital expenditure budget for these projects, but both are contingent on approval from the City of Glendale.



5. Significantly increase the amount of signage on campus roadways and in the lots.

6. Identify "blackout" dates where large groups or special events would not be allowed on campus (i.e., first week of the new semester).

The committee plans for most of these changes to be implemented by the beginning of the Fall 2010-11 semester. There may be additional changes that could be considered, and suggestions are welcome.

The current committee includes Jack Glynn, director of facilities; Chuck Gadzichowski, director of physical plant; Kris Herrick, director of facilities coordination; Andrew DeRubertis, director of security,

and Jenny Nichols, director of alumni relations and special events. The committee anticipates including others at various points of discernment and discussion. Student and student life representation are anticipated as well.


