FLOOD CLEANUP, REPAIR EFFORTS CONTINUING

University staff and external cleanup crews are diligently working to repair damage that occurred on the main campus as a result of the July 22 flooding.

Flooding occurred in the basement of every building with the exception of new Bonaventure Hall, the Powerhouse, and the Stein Center.

There was also some main floor flooding of the Student Union. Roof leaks have been reported in the center wing of Clare Hall, the Fieldhouse, and the Library. However, these leaks should not affect the timeline for the opening of the renovated Athletics facilities or the new Information Commons on the first floor of the Library.

Both of the projects should be completed by the start of the fall semester.

A National Disaster Recovery Team from Belfor, as well as a crew from Total Cleaning, are assisting in the cleanup efforts. Anchor Moving has been on campus as well, moving furniture, boxes, files, etc., from affected areas, and Balestrieri Environmental has performed asbestos abatement when needed.

In order to meet the needs of students and best prepare for the fall semester, five areas will be the focus in the next several weeks.

- Basement of Duns Scotus
This work is critical to ensure enough classroom space for the fall semester. The target date of completion is Friday, Aug. 20.
- Basement of Assisi Hall
This area, which houses both student residences and lounges, is expected to be completed by Saturday, Aug. 7.
- College of Education and Leadership offices (Clare Hall basement)
Approximately 20 faculty members have been displaced from this area, and the goal is to restore their offices by Monday, Aug. 16.
- Student Union
The Union will be closed until the start of the fall semester while a new floor is installed. In the interim, a temporary union has been established in Clare Dining Hall, providing evening students with the same amenities that they are used to receiving in the Union.
- Clare Hall laundry room.

“It’s been a lot of hard work, but we’ve tried to restore the affected areas as quickly as possible,” said Jack Glynn, director of facilities.

Janet McKnight, director of treasury and risk management, is coordinating with the University’s insurance carrier to collect the pertinent financial information and filing the claim. Damaged materials/equipment must be inventoried before being discarded, so please contact Glynn or McKnight if you have materials to report.


